City Attorney Schroeter explained that this is an emergency ordinance because the city has no ordinance on telecommunications, and this would allow the city to take control of the location of towers.

Council Member asked to clarify what the city is going to control.

City Manager responded that it is too soon for them to understand it and for the city to understand it, but it is not too soon to start protecting so basically, we will go through with the utility companies step by step and identify what is better for the city and the utility companies. Superintendent Resendez shared that the district had some concerns about passing the ordinance, but he met with City Manager Wooner and had some clarification on the matter. Since then, the district is on board with approving the ordinance.

Mrs. Woods thanked the Council for thinking ahead and protecting the city.
